



What is Neuropsychological Testing?

Neuropsychological testing is a comprehensive evaluation of cognitive, behavioral, and emotional functioning that helps explain how the brain is working in daily life. Using standardized tests and a detailed clinical interview, testing examines intellectual functioning, attention, processing speed, memory, language, visual-spatial skills, executive functioning (planning, organization, flexibility, inhibition, working memory), academic skills, and emotional/behavioral regulation. Results clarify diagnoses, identify strengths and needs, and guide practical recommendations for treatment, school, work, and home supports.

When is Neuropsychological Testing Needed?

Neuropsychological testing is helpful when there are concerns about learning, attention, development, social or emotional functioning, concussion/brain injury, neurologic or medical conditions, or cognitive decline. It is often recommended to clarify diagnosis when symptoms are complex, overlapping, or unclear, and to provide a detailed plan for treatment, accommodations, and school/work planning.

Typical Costs & Length Of Appointment

- Independent School Admissions Testing: **\$300**
- Psychological Evaluations: **\$1,800**
- Other evaluations range from **\$3,800–\$4,500**
- A clear fee quote is provided prior to scheduling

➔ RPA evaluations are private-pay. Fees vary based on the referral question and scope of testing, and families and individuals receive a clear quote before scheduling.

➔ Autism evaluations are tailored to the specific referral question and can be more targeted in scope.

➔ Comprehensive evaluations usually include a 1–1.5 hour intake plus 3–6 hours of testing.

➔ Written reports are typically completed within a few weeks after the final testing session.

➔ A feedback session is included for comprehensive evaluations to review results and recommendations.
